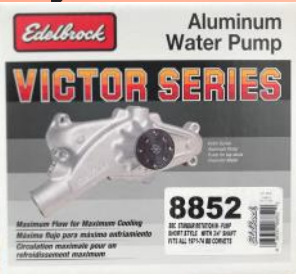

Vette's Catch Gold Fever....!!!!

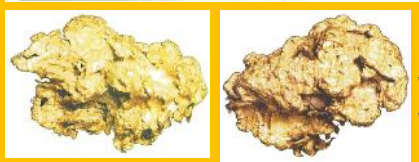
If you have the chance to come on a 9 day run, or even a long weekend, I highly recommend it. We had an absolute blast on Peter and Lynda's 'Vette's Catch Gold Fever' run! The chance to really get to know club members and secrets they have!!! One thing that came out whilst we were all prospecting for Gold was a history on Dale Goldsmith, who grew up in Ballarat and also his father. Wow, what a man!!! Not enough room or time to tell you everything, and it is just so interesting

it is hard to pick out the good bits, as it is all good!!! Here is a little snippet to whet your appetite for next months newsletter!!!



Setting the Scene:

It was the depression era of the 1930s and it wasn't a good time. It was hard work with people trying to hold themselves and their families together. Most made it through but it left a life-long mark on all who suffered its effects. Len Goldsmith was a teenager during the 1030s and he worked hard. The work was often physically demanding and he saw little for his efforts. The principal district of this account is the head gullies that make up Slaty Creek, Creswick. This is roughly halfway between Creswick and Ballarat, not far from the White Swan Reservoir. Len was part of those times and a reality that often saw very little money, personal risk and adventure a few laughs and disappointments but mostly just hard work.



"Little Beauty" 28 oz (871 grams)

My parents home was number 10, Yarowee Street, Ballarat. My parents bought that place in 1916 and I was born in 1917. I left school at about 13yo and went straight to work woodcutting, spud digging, threshing machine and straw presses. Christmas day was always the first day on the farm for cutting hay. We always started on Christmas day. I never did know why. We would stop work to have our Christmas dinner, but we would then go back to work in the afternoon. The meal was probably roasted rabbit.

Rabbit was usually one of the main meals in those times. Stewed or roasted. I have eight children in all. Heather, Grant, Leigh, Leneice, Dale, Lyndon, Glenn and Christopher. There was not much money around and plenty of competition for work. That kept what you earned very low so you did as much as you could to get some money together. This was all depression time. If it was too wet for spuds or woodcutting, you would be mining. In the summer time there were the straw presses and threshing machines or planting spuds. We got paid a shilling an hour on the threshing machines. We were up at Barkstead one time at a cocky's place working a threshing machine. They would put all the meals on for us. They had all the big tables out but you couldn't see it for flies. They couldn't help it, Nobody could eat anything., All the tucker was wasted. Slept in the haystack at night to be ready for a daylight start.....
