


Our December meeting will go ahead but you will need to register on Eventbrite to help with our COVID tracing.

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SHARE THE PASSION

Seans random rambling #20 LS Junkyard Dog.

The deadline to make sure this jalopy can roar up a hill at full throttle is looming close now, Collingrove have put on a late meeting now that Covid restrictions have been lifted and it's a perfect opportunity to get a run in before the Mt Gambier Hillclimb.

There is probably about another 10 jobs to do, going racing is like having a part time job if you own a Corvette! I also had to replace the entire toe arm assembly on the rear of the car after some issues with the rear end squirming, coz no one likes having a squirmy rear end – especially at speed.

October 11 is bright and sunny, this is not usual Collingrove Hillclimb weather!

Kirsty is also co driving for the day. We will start with the softer tune in the MSD box and see how it feels. Bob Butler will also be running with the MattyB RX7 coupe.

Started with an easy 36.7 without even trying - how easy is this I think to myself. After a protest was lodged by Kirsty (who couldn't see over the hood) the scoop was removed. Run 2 slightly quicker.

Run 3 I decided to use the custom (dyno) tune, well it just wanted to spin the tyres thru every corner - had a sideways moment turn 2, Kirsty had an even bigger moment on turn 2! Back to the soft tune.

Managed a 35.8 - good enough for a class win. Kirsty had a best of 39.9. Bob finishes 4th in his class with a 37.4 The only thing that fell off was a starter wire – Bob Butler gave me a hand and it was fixed quickly.

Not bad all things considered for its first outing, I haven't driven the car for nearly a year, it was struggling for rear grip and it drives a little bit differently with this engine in – its more of a revver than the old 383.



Next up is the Legends of the Lake Hillclimb Mt Gambier, 3 weeks later. Only major changes will be a couple of new Nitto 315 rear tyres, replace the tailshaft U joints (just in case) and hook up a thermo fan in front of the radiator.

We met up with Bob and Karen at Tailem Bend and headed off with cars in tow to Mt Gambier, and sure enough it started raining as we headed south from Keith. We were supposed to stop at Penola for a coffee break, but how was I to know they have moved the entire town away from the Highway? Anyhow we got to Mt Gambier ahead of schedule, so it was straight to Valley Lake, where the pits are for the hillclimb.

The Legends of the Lake Hillclimb is a once a year event where the 1.6 km uphill run from the bottom of Valley Lake goes to the caravan park and then up towards the Centenary Tower carpark. It is the public road which is blocked off each year for the event.

We set up our camp for the next 3 days, complete with generator, tv and gas cooker!



Rob and MattyB will be running on Friday/Saturday/Sunday and Black Bitch will be running Saturday/Sunday, both in the 2wd Street Reg over 2000 cc class, with 19 entries in our class.

This track is twice as long and twice as fast as Collingrove so it should be interesting to see how BB goes, we will start with the soft LS-HO tune.

Saturday was a cool and overcast day, we managed to get 6 runs in. First run was an easy 1.03 with no issues. The following 5 runs were 1.00, 1.00, 1.00, 1.00 and 1.00! The new toe rod arms and rear tyres have tightened up the rear end, so that is a positive but the cold track holds it back.

Rob has also managed a best of 1.00 with a very clunky rear shocker.



Sunday brought some sun out at last, I did the first 2 runs on the soft tune as the track was still cold from overnight, but by run 3 it was time for the dyno tune and a brave pill.

I was rewarded straight away with a 59.3 and then a 59.00. We had 1 more run for the day and I tried a bit too hard for that 58, got a bit of oversteer on one corner resulting in a 59.3.


Not too bad, missed out on a 58 but 59.00 is still nearly one second faster than its previous best of 59.9. The car still has a bit more in it.

Rob ran several 1.01's on Sunday but was battling against a left rear shocker that was slowly destroying itself.

Black Bitch finishes 3rd in class with a 59.00 behind a turbo Skyline and a turbo GT Skyline and Rob finishes 5th in class with a best of 1.00, behind an LJ Torana GTR.

Its off to The Barn for one of those fancy steaks to top off the weekend!



Adelaide to Canberra Corvette Nationals 2021 Road Trip Proposal





For those of you who are considering making the road trip to the Corvette Nationals in Canberra at Easter next year here is a proposed schedule for you to consider in order to set time aside and travel as a group with your fellow club members. We may even pick up a few from interstate along the way.

The following attendance schedule of two overnight stops is the same we did in 2015 so it will be familiar to those who participated at that time.

The only change is arriving in Canberra on the Thursday and not the Friday to give more time to socialize and prepare your Corvette for the full-on weekend of activities.

Tuesday 30th March. Adelaide to Hay. 560kms.

Wednesday 31th March. Hay to Gundagai. 353 kms

Thursday 1st April. Gundagai to Canberra. 162kms.

The return trip is a bit more leisurely coming back over the Snowy Mountains on the Alpine Way and Murray Valley Highway with the following proposed –

Monday 5th April. Canberra to Jindabyne. 200kms.

Tuesday 6th April. Jindabyne to Beechworth. 282kms.

Wednesday 7th April. Beechworth to Bendigo. 250ks.

Thursday 8th April. Bendigo to Horsham. 214kms.

Friday 9th April. Horsham to Adelaide. 427kms.

Although the distances are not long in most instances it will give time to have plenty of stop overs along the way to see the sights as well as spend a bit more time at destinations to look around.

As we have previously done Jenny and I are happy to make all the accommodation bookings for the group and you pay on check out the following morning.

Also as we will require to do group bookings, depending how many are interested, it is important to have these in place early so it would be desirable to have your **expression of interest to us by January 31**st **2021** in order appropriate arrangements can be put in place.

Road trips to the Nationals are a great way to share time with other Corvette owners in the club with many great memories to share for years to come.

This is a proposal only at this stage and as we know may have to be changed depending on social circumstances closer to the event.


