Membership Renewal Information



Dear Member,

I hope that this letter finds you and your family fit and well. After a recent audit of our membership records, it has been found that your membership has not been renewed for the coming year. We understand that you may have forgotten to renew, so please read the important information below. If you have recently sold your car, we understand that you are not renewing but if you could let us know so that we can update our records.

Important information for those on the Club Registration Scheme.

<u>Membership of a Club must be paid and Log books must be signed before 31st</u> <u>December 2021 for vehicles to be able to continue to be legally driven on the road. If</u> <u>your log book isn't signed by this date then you will be driving an unregistered</u> <u>vehicle. This will also mean that if you are involved in an accident that your car will</u> <u>be uninsured for third party bodily injury insurance.</u> None of us want to see that costly event happen to anyone.

Issuing of new log books are required every 3 years.

If your log book is not signed, please notify the club registrar with the reason why (e.g. car off road for repairs or other reasons) before the 31st December 2021.

If your membership has not been renewed and the log book signed before the 31st December 2021, the Club is required to notify the DPTI of your Non-Financial Status. We will be notifying DPTI as of the 31^{ed} of January as to any members that have not renewed. DPTI may then cancel Club Registration for your vehicle within 7 days and your car will not be covered. Fines and or more can apply along with your loss of conditional registration. It is a requirement under the new code that the club notifies the department as a condition of maintaining our recognition status for the purposes of the scheme.

Your support in the form of membership and participation in the club is vital in ensuring our ongoing success as a club. Our club exists for its members and there are a number of benefits or activities available that members can enjoy. They include the following;

- A full colour newsletter each month by email.
- Monthly General meeting with supper provided.
- Club car runs on the first Sunday after each monthly general meeting (organised by any member that wishes to arrange a run. Feel free to ask for advice).
- Club dinners every third Friday of the month (arranged by club members and held at various locations around Adelaide).
- Access to Technical knowledge and expertise (some members have over 35 years' experience).
- Access to exclusive Club Merchandise.
- Lucky members draw for those present at the Monthly meeting.
- Organised regular events such as Club car runs both locally and interstate.
- Hosting of the Corvette Nationals when it occurs in Adelaide(generally every six years0.
- A dedicated committee of volunteers.

We have arranged a dinner at Watermark Glenelg on Saturday 12th February for 6 pm – 6:30 pm.



Maelyn wants to thank everyone who helped with setting up, food preparation, serving of food. She was particularly impressed by the way so many helped with clearing at the end of the night.





Adelaide to Canberra Corvette Nationals 2022 Road Trip Proposal



For those of you who are considering making the road trip to the Corvette Nationals in Canberra at Easter next year here is a proposed schedule for you to consider in order to set time aside and travel as a group with your fellow club members. We may even pick up a few from interstate along the way.

The following attendance schedule on the way over with two overnight stops is the same we did in 2015 so it will be familiar to those who participated at that time.

The only change is arriving in Canberra on the Thursday instead of the Friday to give more time to socialize and prepare your Corvette for the full-on weekend of activities.

Tuesday 12th April. Adelaide to Hay. 560kms.

Wednesday 13th April. Hay to Gundagai. 353 kms

Thursday 14th April. Gundagai to Canberra. 162kms.

The return trip is a bit more leisurely coming back over the Snowy Mountains on the Alpine Way and Murray Valley Highway with the following proposed –

Monday 18th April. Canberra to Jindabyne. 200kms.

Tuesday 19th April. Jindabyne to Beechworth. 282kms.

Wednesday 20th April. Beechworth to Bendigo. 250ks.

Thursday 21st April. Bendigo to Horsham. 214kms.

Friday 22nd April. Horsham to Adelaide. 427kms.

Although the distances are not long in most instances it will give time to have plenty of stop overs along the way to see the sights as well as spend a bit more time at destinations to look around.

As we have previously done Jenny and I are happy to make all the accommodation bookings for the group and you pay on check out the following morning.

Also, as we will require to do group bookings, it is important to have your expression of interest in **to us by Saturday 15th January 2022** in order appropriate arrangements can be put in place with the aim for all be in the same establishment. We will also need to know if you will be trailering your Corvette to make space at Motels.

Car of the Month

Karen & Rob's C3

It was in 2004 that Kev planted the seed of Corvette and the hunt was on and mid 2004 one was located and with the approval of the Bride it was purchased.

The car had to be a 1968 to 1972 chrome bumper and preference was to get a 70-72, didn't want a big block as I had owned trucks for 25 years and know all about fuel bills.

The car purchased was a 1971 garden variety stock standard Vette but the body was in great shape, it was, and still is LHD, and mechanically was ok, I actually drove it home on trade plates and that was the last time it was driven on the road until Oct 2021.

There was surface rust on the chassis so the only real way to fix it was of course to take the body off and seeing we went that far lets take everything else out as well, the bare chassis was then sandblasted and painted,

While everything else was out, may as well do that as well, so the engine was rebuilt, the gearbox rebuilt, the diff rebuilt, trailing arms rebuilt, new brakes, new steering and about this time the Bride turned into the Minister of War and Finance.

Once everything was refitted the body was painted and bumpers re-chromed and according to the Minister every nut that could be purchased from the US was, the year was now 2019 and the Minister was slightly concerned at the time taken to get to this point.

The Minister for War appeared and said that the Minister for Finance would not reappear until the 1989 C4 was sold, apparently I needed the incentive of not having a Corvette to drive to get the 71 finished. Now if you have ever started something and had more than one sleep before you finish it you know that you forget one or two things, at this point all I can say is "thank god for Graham" and when things don't go quite to plan his explanation is "it's a Corvette" which I now have permantly burnt into my brain.

The registration process was straight forward, the plan was to get the identity check done at Nuriootpa police station and then to Angaston for the inspection, one day, one permit – WRONG – a phone call to Nuriootpa police had my place of residence on the wrong side of the creek and therefore out of their police district – it's a Corvette – "you will need to go to Regency Park for the Identity Check". On the Wednesday it took 5 hours (4hrs 40mins waiting - 20mins for the check) – it's a Corvette- and,

the Vette broke down on the way home and required a ride on a truck to home and the next day a ride to get the issue fixed – it's a Corvette-, the Vette was picked up 9 am Friday morning and the roadworthy Inspection was at 10.30 am got there at 10 am and went straight in and this was the least painful part of the whole process, it passed with flying colours.

Paperwork in hand take the Vette home, take the dog to the Vet, and, then down to Kevs to get the Club registration paperwork then off to Service SA at Gawler where the plates were waiting to complete the process.

At the counter paperwork was presented and the Vette was to be in joint names but the Club paperwork only listed my name – it's a Corvette - and how did they know whether the Minister was a member of the Corvette club, frantic calls to Kev and Gary didn't solve the problem so a double frantic call to the Minister to get to Gawler with her membership card (if she could find it) before 5 pm it was now 4.30pm, at 4.50pm it was registered.

I didn't have any energy left to put the plates on the Vette until Saturday.

The restoration process was a piece of cake taking seventeen and a half years now the Minister wants her 1946 Ford jailbar truck done but she doesn't think either of us will live long enough to see it happen, she has no faith.



In the last couple of months, while reading the club newsletter, I took note of the need for fresh ideas and I wanted to think about a fresh destination to spark some interest. A chance conversation at a Coffee and Chrome gathering helped me to uncover a gem, and on further investigation a plan was formed. It was now time to get the CCSA folk out before the Christmas festivities began...

On a fine and still morning, the destination to the Prosser family's Aussie Apricots and Cruise Revolution, began down on the flats, where my wingman Peter McBride marshalled and orchestrated the majority of the members through the Adelaide Hills to a meeting point where we gathered and greeted before the onward journey.

In total there was a train of 22 vettes and approximately 50 members rumbling down the South Eastern Freeway to the Monarto exit, and our final destination in Mypolonga.

It was here that Paul and Kathy were awaiting, amongst their apricot plantation for our arrival and the day began with an entertaining presentation detailing the history and development of their family business. They opened our eyes to their entrepreneurial spirit, passion for growing quality fruit and ultimate ability to diversify and grow their business through both good and challenging times. I am sure that everyone who came up for this cruise enjoyed the day, and motoring memorabilia.




















