



## McLaren Vale Vintage & Classic

A large grassed area at Serafino Winery was the meeting point for this year's McLaren Vale Vintage & Classic. Over 530 cars comprising of a wide variety of different makes and models squeezed onto the site in anticipation of the day ahead (including a total of 12 Corvettes). 


