Can you believe its coming to that time of the year again. Memberships are due by 31 December


2024 and we will be doing the annual 'signing of the log books' at November and December meetings.



Membership Renewal Information

It is that time of year again when membership renewal fees are due. Membership fees for 2025 can now be paid using the BSB and Account number listed in the club newsletter

The November (6th) and December (4th) meetings will be our annual membership and log book signing. To help these two meetings run more smoothly, it would be appreciated if members could do the following.

- 1) Pay your membership (eft preferably), or attend a meeting to make payment. If you have paid by EFT, please collect your receipt from the membership table.
- 2) If you are a Conditional member and have log books to be signed, please proceed to the log book signing tables with your CCSA membership receipt.
- Please bring with you the following: CCSA Membership payment receipt. Current Log book. Current Registration Papers.

Please attend either the November or December meeting with the above so the team can sign your log book for the next 12 months, deeming your car registered.

Important information for those on the Conditional Registration Scheme.

Membership of a Club must be paid and Log books must be signed before 31st December 2024 for vehicles to be able to continue to be legally driven on the road. If your log book isn't signed by this date then you will be driving an unregistered vehicle. This will also mean that if you are involved in an accident that your car will be uninsured for third party bodily injury insurance. None of us want to see that costly event happen to anyone.

Issuing of new log books are required every 3 years.

If your log book is not signed, please notify the club registrar with the reason why (e.g. car off road for repairs or other reasons) before the 31st December 2024.

If your membership has not been renewed and the log book signed before the 31st December 2024, the Club is required to notify the DPTI of your Non-Financial Status. We will be notifying DPTI as of the 31st of January 2025 as to any members that have not renewed. DPTI may then **cancel Conditional Registration** for your vehicle within 7 days. It is a requirement under the new code that the club notifies the department as a condition of maintaining our recognition status for the purposes of the scheme.

Full Membership fees are only \$80 per year for Metro members and \$40 for Country members. Associate membership fees are only \$20. Log Books are \$10 so please check that yours is in date before paying your fees and include that in your payment. Membership update forms can be found on the club website (www.corvetteclubofsouthaustralia.com.au) and emailed direct to myself at the email address below.

We would love to see you at our club general meetings and events. The General meetings are held on the **first** Wednesday of each month from 7.00 p.m. at the Glenelg Baseball Club, Anderson Ave, Glenelg North.

HEADS UP – CLUB TALK ETIQUETTE FOR CLUB MEMBERS ATTENDING EVENTS

DINNERS

We would like to highlight some housekeeping rules for club members conduct when booking and attending events.

Please have consideration of the vendors and organisers of club events.

If you have booked a place at a seated event and are no longer able to attend, please ensure that you inform the organiser with reasonable notice or by due date allowing other members to attend.

Do not attend an event expecting a place if you have not made a prior booking.

We must respect the vendors capacity to hold the numbers allocated as this impacts their level of seating availability and staffing for meals and serving.

Not providing notice that you can't attend, could become a cost to the club if we have prepaid deposits for attendees.

<u>RUNS</u>

When attending a club run that has two (or more) meeting points (eg. a North and South meeting point), the organiser may designate a mid point rendezvous location. It is important to adhere to that location and timing for the following reasons.

This ensures we all arrive at the final destination as a group at the same time without creating disorganisation / misunderstandings.

If there are incidents along the way, club members will be aware to provide support to those affected.

No changes to be made to the route of the event unless approved by organiser of the event.

It is our intention to create an ethos that demonstrates professionalism and unity which in turn gives us credibility in the public arena.

WHEN IT IS NOT WHAT YOU THINK

(or what could possibly go wrong) ARTICLE BY PETER BARTLETT

We decided to go on the Graham and Debbie Johns club run from Bolivar to Gladstone on 7th July. This run was to be a 400km round trip so a full tank of juice in the C3 was required.

As we all know, the limiting factor on long runs for C3's, is that they like to visit petrol stations. Apart from some early light rain and wet roads (starting out with a clean car - bugger!) we had a good trip to Gladstone.

We were met at our lunch stop, The Booyoolee Brew, by other club members and a couple of Vettes from Port Pirie. After the obligatory photo shoot in front of the Brew House it was time for lunch. Lunch over and a look around, soon it was time to head back to Adelaide.

The trip back was mostly at 110kph. All was going well until we got to the Port River expressway about 8 kms from home. Suddenly, the temperature gauge went into the red! Oh crap! With Rudy and Kay behind, we slowed down to about 40kph, and the gauge began to slowly come back down. As soon as we got over 40kph up the temperature would go. Decided to drive slowly home and keep one eye on the gauge.



What could it be?

Radiator leak, Thermostat buggered, Bottom radiator hose collapsing under suction (no spring inside) – yes it happens, Blown head gasket, something else?

We got home ok and parked up. The next morning, I began the fault-finding process. Still had coolant in the radiator not full, when pressurised it was not holding constant pressure, it had developed a leak from the core.

Being probably an original 53-year-old radiator, the decision was made to replace with a new one. That must be the problem. So, a call to Dave (Firebird Trading), saw a new radiator and bottom hose on order. Cont. Next page.

A week later it arrived. I fitted a new radiator and bottom hose along with a new thermostat, ah that should fix the overheating. Started the car and ran up to temperature at idle perfect, but as soon as I increased the revs the temperature gauge would climb quickly towards the red. Ok what else could it be?


Temperature gauge was checked for correct operation by earthing the connector and that was all good. The temperature sender was also checked and found to be ok.

I then noticed that as soon as I revved the engine with the door open the interior lights would flicker and the temp gauge would climb even though the engine was not too hot.

On further investigation the problem was found. The alternator was stuffed (has internal voltage regulator) affecting voltage output and thus the temp gauge. Another trip to Dave and problem solved a new alternator. Hope this helps other C3 owners.



The 1958 concept Corvette XP-700 (above) was developed as a personal car for head of GM Styling, Bill Mitchell. Starting with a 1958 Corvette, the red fiberglass body was redesigned with a low proboscis up front, air scoops, and Grand Prix-inspired wire wheels. Power came from a 283/230 four-speed manual.

After 1958, the XP-700 was modified with a longer and smaller grille, an redesigned tail (which would influence the rear for the 1961 Corvette), Atomic-Age double-bubble plastic canopy, Lucas "Flame Thrower" headlamps, Dayton wire wheels, integrated front brake cooling ducts below the headlights, forward-slanting vertical louvers, sidepipes, rear- brake cooling ducts, and several other mods. Repainted metallic silver, the XP-700 then became part of General Motors' show car entourage.


