

Corvette Museum to keep part of the sinkhole?

After months of debate, the Corvette Museum's board looks like they might want to keep part of the Skydome sinkhole and make it into an attraction at the museum. While the sinkhole was a devastating loss at first resulting in swallowing up eight Corvettes, it has actually had an interesting effect on the Corvette Museum's popularity — it has skyrocketed.

Board members were faced with a tough decision; do they repair the sinkhole and put the museum back the way it was before the collapse, or do they leave some or all of the sinkhole open to the public? In a weird way, the sinkhole has now become part of the history of the Corvette Museum. It has clearly shown to be a draw for museum-goers as when comparing the period of March through the end of June for 2013 versus 2014, the number of visitors has jumped 59%, admissions income has risen 71%, membership is up 72%, and revenue is up



65%. When you combine the hype around the C7 Corvette release and the unfortunate drama caused by the sinkhole opening up, the numbers do not lie — the sinkhole is a hit!

With 14 board members in attendance at the meeting, it looks like the sinkhole will remain open while more information is gathered about the long term effects of keeping the sinkhole open. Keeping the sinkhole open and "riding the wave" of visitors wanting to see the sinkhole is a great idea because if for some reason interest in the sinkhole ever died out, they could easily fix the sinkhole and put the museum back to normal. For now though, the people have spoken and they want to see the big hole in the ground that swallowed up eight Corvettes!

With the winter weather now truly upon us here in South Australia, it's beginning to get a bit wet under foot.....so have you ever thought about improving the off road capability of your Corvette? We'll our friends in the US seem to have already put their minds to this problem and came up with the creation you can see here.

Known as a 'Mud Bogger' in the states they are about as far from the original intention of the Corvette design as you could possibly imagine! While the purists amongst us will be shaking their heads in disbelief you have to give these guys some credit for thinking outside of the square. The blue machine shown is the result of the TV show 'Monster Garage' where the host Jesse James and his team of manic mechanics race the clock to complete their build.



Starting life as a 1973 C3 Corvette it has gone through lets say some "minor" modifications to become the terrain busting vehicle you can see here. It's fitted with a 454 big block coupled to a TH400 transmission, the front end was replaced with a Toyota 4Runner unit, and yes that is a driveshaft you can see to the front wheels....chain driven of course! To make sure there was no lack of power a nitrous oxide kit



has been added for good measure and racing air shockers connect those massive wheels to the frame

So if you're getting a bit bored with your stock standard Corvette and have a stack of cash to burn.....then this is could be the machine for you!!!



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


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## Tommy's Tech Talk.... Spark Plug Drama

How hard is it to change spark plugs I ask? Well it should to be real easy. But there always has to be 1 plug which causes problems.

I can get to all my plugs easily except for the #6 and #8 on the right bank. With the right hand drive conversion on my 68, access to the 2 rear plugs on the right is difficult. Access from the top is limited by the power brake booster, and access from the bottom is awkward due to the steering box, starter and exhaust. I know I can get to #8 from underneath, so I put the car up on ramps and got it out OK. But #6 plug is a bitch. Lying on my back with limited joint movement I can't maneuver my big hands and arthritic fingers to get to the plug easily. And then there was the added issue with fingers cramping up due to the cold and the awkward position I was stretching them into holding the socket wrench. Lots of crude expletives were expressed in the mistaken belief that the plug would yield if it was sworn at.

Going through my tool box I used every combination of spark plug sockets, extensions and universally jointed ratchets I had without being able to get a good purchase on the plug. I persisted and eventually managed to get it out using a 12 point socket and open end spanner. Hoo Rah!

I checked the gaps of all the new plugs as I put them in. It took me no more than 10 minutes to get the 4 new left bank plugs and the 2 front right bank plugs in. Got under the car and managed to get #8 in after another 5 minutes of wriggling and writhing with my gut hard against the underside of the car. For a brief moment I considered I should heed some of Sophie's advice on limiting portion size of meals... But that was only a brief thought for a nano-second or two. Tommy loves his food.

Anyway, it finally came to #6. OK. I tried getting my hand in from the top to start the plug in the thread. No go. Just couldn't get my hand far enough in at the right angle to thread the plug on.

Tried from underneath and also had difficulty. If I had a hoist it would be OK, but lying on the ground I just could not get my fingers positioned such that I could align the plug with the hole. It was also now getting dark and I couldn't see so was going by "feel". I should have stopped and let it go for the following day. But I persisted in my somewhat European stubborn manner so I could get the car off the ramp and prevent the expected rant from Sophie to get the car out of the pergola.

My persistence prevailed and I managed to get the plug started on the thread. It was barely on the very first thread but I couldn't get any grip on the plug with my fingertips to screw it in. I grabbed the same socket and open ender I used to remove it and began screwing it in. It started OK, but after a turn I realized it was too tight and was most likely cross threaded. BUGGER! So out it came and then I had to try and realign it. Now it was really dark, and the torch I had was only producing shadows which made the task even harder. I tried for about 15 minutes without success and then called it a night to continue next day.

I woke up early next day and tackled the plug again. What an absolute PITA (pain in the arse) it was. To get past the obstructions I used some rubber hose as a flexible extension to align the plug, but no matter how many attempts I tried, it would always fall into the wrong cross thread which had started.

#### **BUGGER!**

OK.... What to do. I considered getting a tap to clean out the thread. I went to a local tool store and the only one on the shelf was a high speed steel cutter at \$75. Hmmm no thanks. I went to another store and they could get me a plain tool steel tap for \$19 overnight. Order placed. So during the day I'm thinking... How am I going to start the tap correctly to ensure I engage the original thread? If I start the tap



incorrectly, it will cut a new thread all the way through, possibly stuffing the hole completely and also producing swarf which could fall into the cylinder... More expletives uttered, this time in my mind only. Now I'm thinking the proper way to tackle this is to remove the head and tap it from the inside out. That way the original thread could be used to align the tap correctly, and it would just cut the damaged starting thread to the correct alignment. I let that digest for a few hours whilst I did some other chores.

Pulling the head off was not what I wanted to do. I recall that my right head would not clear the brake booster whilst the motor was in the car, so the brake booster would have to be removed also, meaning having to bleed the entire brake system too... DOUBLE BUGGER!!

What was supposed to be half hour quick change of plugs had turned into an extended week long nightmare.

Then I was thinking, wouldn't it be great if there was a tool which could be inserted from the outside into the plughole which could then tap the thread outwards. Nah... not possible said the "glass half-empty" side of my mind. The other side of my brain said "Why not?" So I Googled it, and this is what I found. (Click link below)

A 14mm Back-Tap Thread Repair Tool. A tool designed for exactly what I needed. The idea is simple enough. The thread cutting end is slotted such that it compresses to the clearance diameter so it can be inserted into the plug hole. The tapered bush on the end is



then pulled in using the knurled knob on the other end to expand the threaded flutes onto the proper original good threads deep in the hole. Then unwind the tool to chase the thread outwards, re-cutting the damaged threads in perfect alignment as it comes out. And it draws out any swarf so no fragments remain internally to cause potential scoring of the cylinder wall.

So how did it go?

FANTASTIC! Cleaned up the thread with a couple of passes, lined up the plug and it screwed straight in. Awesome!

**DID YOU KNOW** A French road cyclist named <u>Albert Champion</u> set up the Champion Ignition Company in Flint, Michigan to manufacture spark plugs in 1908. The company was renamed the AC Spark Plug Company in 1909, after his initials. He passed away in 1927, and GM bought the majority shares of his company from his estate and the company still exists as AC Delco.

By the way, how many people know that the Chev spark plug thread is actually a metric size.... 14mm with 1.25mm pitch.

This is because spark plugs were made for the European market initially and US car manufacturers adopted the same plug thread.




