
club convention committee) ask any members that have any expertise that may be useful or

The Barossa Valley has begun to bloom in readiness for our event and the picturesque land scape changes every day now.



Log books will be signed at the club meetings on 6th Novemeber and 4th December

Before signing owners must present

- 1 Receipt of club subs for next year's membership (the 2013 calender year'
- 2 Vehicle for inspection if new log book required
- 3 Current registration papers
- 4 Vehicle Exemption Document for left hand drive vehicles, issued by DPTI
- 5 Statuary Declaration required every year at log book signing

Statuary declaration must declare vehicle eligibility to the scheme and detail any modifications that have been made since last inspection, if none made then the statuary declaration must declare that.

BOOKS WILL NOT BE SIGNED IF ALL DOCUMENTS ARE NOT PRODUCED

Books have to be signed before December 31st for vehicles to be legally driven on road, if your book isn't signed you are driving an unregistered vehicle Inspections and issue of new log books will be every 3 years

If your log book is not signed, notify club registrar with a reason why. Eg car off road for repairs

If your membership has not been renewed and the log book signed by the 31st of January DPTI will be notified and the Conditional Registration will be cancelled by the department.

It is a requirement under the new code that the club notifies the department as a condition of maintaining our recognition status for the purposes of the



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
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
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Ok in case you missed it last month I am a self confessed "Peter Brock" fan for life......okay so last month we reviewed the book covering his early years Peter Brock Road to Glory. This month we have the full story 'Peter Brock How Good is This'the real story......Okay this one is a soft back published by Penguin Books written by Wayne Webster an

accomplished journalist and driver, navigator, come petrol head himself. The qualifying piece of this book is the authors personal relationship with the subject Peter Geoffrey Brock. These two spent more than an hour or two in a car together, the story of the exit of a John Williamson tape at 160 kilometres an hour in the out back and its subsequent replacement by all of his albums at the next fuel stop are one of the high lights of the book. The author Wayne Webster has obviously pulled a lot of strings and managed to spend just a few hours with those that were closest to this amazing man. He has anecdotes from family members, close friends, rivals and team mates. The book covers the entire life of the man that dominated Australian motor sport. From his childhood through to the dominance of Bathurst and the Marlboro Holden Dealer Team. This is a warts and all look at an Australian Icon. No punches are pulled, how the hell did a hard drinking self confessed two pot screamer become the national symbol

campaign, wearing the famous 05 number. This one is an easy read, but for my taste a little too ocker, the author strains himself to be an ordinary Aussie bloke to often. Split into 12 chapters and 320 pages this is an enjoyable romp through motoring history. There are few photographs around the 14 page mark which split the book into thirds. The book paints a picture of a very ordinary man with an extra ordinary talent, as a true Aussie bloke who could relate to the ordinary fan. He had a little grooming via his early days in the Holden Dealer Team on how to behave and be a public man. Holden couldn't resist him even through the polariser

proven one way or the other. This book shows the real bloke the man with in the legend. Peter not so perfect is the real title of this book, a bloke who really didn't give a toss about money, liked a beer and more to the point liked women. The priorities in his life were obviously cars, mates, women, beer, cars and more cars.

After the successful Mallala day we have come up with the club Autocross Day. I have been out to Adelaide International Raceway and spoken to Andrew Russo who now runs the track. We can use the track on a Sunday for \$1000 (gst included), if we have 20 participants that works out to \$50 each. There are

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SHARE THE PASSION

Chevrolet Racing teased us with

the new 2014 Corvette C7.R race car at the Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion. The successor to the Corvette C6.R will make its motorsports debut next January at the Rolex 24 at Daytona and is expected to compete at Le Mans and other endurance events next year. The C7.R's first public

appearance at the Laguna Seca racetrack, was in a heavily camouflaged paint job in a black and white checkerboard pattern. Factory driver Tommy Milner was at the wheel.

The racing version of the redesigned 2014 Corvette was decked out with a massive rear wing and a deep front dam with several air intakes. Hot air also exits through huge intake slots behind the front wheel arches. If you look closely at the rear of the car there is a huge splitter plate, to assist with the aerodynamics but not changing the rear bumper design from the road car.

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We got our first peek at the 2014 Corvette C7.R when GM released a quartet of pictures to an eager public. These were followed by many spectator pictures from the four hot laps turned by the C7R. While © MARSHALLPRUETT


many of the details remain up in the air, what we do know is that the Corvette C7.R will make its racing debut on January 25th, 2014 at the 24 Hours of Daytona. This will be the start of the all-new United Sports Car Racing series, which sees GRAND-AM and American Le Mans join forces in a unified road racing series.

Just about everything else we want to know is still secret at this time. While the production Corvette is slated to get a

455 horsepower, 6.2 litre LT1 V8 engine, the C7.R Corvette will receive an updated direct-injection version of the 5.5 litre ethanol-fuelled V8 used in the C6.R. That said, there are still similarities between the road and racing versions of the Corvette beyond it's good looks.



Both cars will be using an all-aluminium chassis, and Corvette Racing's team of drivers is likely to carry over as well. The car was kept in the shed right up until it's run around the track, as the Corvette was the margue vehicle for the weekend there were many versions in the car park.













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
